Annual Dues Renewals ~ Paid Life Membership

It's that time of year! Soon after the Department Convention each year, Detachments should begin collecting and submitting the annual dues of their annual members. The Member Retention Team (MRT) is the main point of contact to accomplish this by sending out letters, post cards, making phone calls, and/or home visits to annual members, reminding and encouraging them to pay their dues ASAP. National gets a bit backlogged with the renewals pouring in from all over the country, so it's important to submit early and often!

Be sure your Paymaster does NOT hold on to anyone's dues while waiting for all the others to come in!! It would be great if everyone paid all at once at a meeting, but that never happens – so transmittals need to be prepared and submitted to the Department Paymaster as the members' dues are received.

Never save the Transmittal form to your desktop to use over and over, as National often makes changes to the form without much fanfare, so you could be using an outdated form with incomplete information. ALWAYS go to the National website at www.mclnational.org and scroll down to the Library (not the Member Library). On the Library you have two choices for the transmittal – the long form and the short form. ALWAYS use the short form as the long form is cumbersome and clunky and not necessary (it just takes up a lot of paper when you print). Use the information on your Detachment Roster to fill in the form with each person's Member ID number, name, address, phone, email, date of birth, profile number, and the number of years for which they are paying. If the person shows as Delinquent on your Roster, contact the Department Paymaster to find out how many years the member owes. The Rosters no longer show their expiration date, so you have no way of knowing unless you use your own records (and hopefully that would match what National has!) So, to be sure you include the correct dollar amount for each person, verify delinquent members with the Department Paymaster.

PAID LIFE MEMBERS

National has been warning us for a few years now that they were going to significantly increase Paid Life Member dues, and they are doing that as of July 1, 2023!! If any of your Annual Members want to become Paid Life Members, they need to do that Immediately! National will accept PLMs at the current rates up until the envelope from the Department Paymaster is postmarked no later than June 30. This means you must submit your Transmittals to the Department Paymaster in sufficient time for her to process them and get them mailed out before the deadline. DO NOT WAIT – DO NOT DELAY The change in rates is included here:

Effective 1 July 2023, the Life Membership Fees will increase as per the following chart:

\$100.00 - 85 years of age and higher	\$0.00	+\$100.00

The above Fees are only available if the member's annual dues have been paid and the member is in good standing. Any member desiring to pay their Life Membership Fees at the current rate, must do so and be post-marked by the Department Paymaster no later than 30 June 2023. Any Life Membership payments postmarked after 30 June 2023 are listed above.

The 2023 Department Convention was held in Mineral Wells, WV May 19-20, 2023 and was well attended. We heard lots of good comments on the training sessions/round tables on Friday afternoon, and the food was really good, just as promised. Ways to Honor Veterans

We just celebrated Memorial Day. Did you find ways to do more this year to honor our brothers and sisters who sacrificed to preserve and protect the freedoms we enjoy? Memorial Day is a day to honor and commemorate the ultimate sacrifice that so many brave men and women have made, so it is certainly a day to pay our respects to these individuals, even if that is in death. Memorial Day is also a day to honor the families of these Veterans who are in our communities. There are so many ways to give back even just a little bit of what these Veterans have sacrificed for us, and below we provide you with just a few ideas to get you started. We thank the Lord for our Veterans and their families and hope that they felt honored, appreciated, and loved this past Memorial Day, and every Memorial Day in the future. (Maybe you can try one or more of these suggestions for next year.)

Many veterans, especially from World War II and the Vietnam War, are elderly and many are in nursing homes. Some also don't have family nearby and would surely love visitors, especially on a day that is so important. Find a veterans nursing home in your area and stop by to bring some joy to someone's day and to thank them for their service. It can be lonely for Veterans in nursing homes and long-term care facilities and they love to have visitors. Typically, these people are not members of a Detachment and can easily be forgotten.

There is at least one national cemetery in every state, as well as in Washington D.C. and Puerto Rico. What more appropriate time to visit one of these places than on Memorial Day? And if you have kids or grandkids, what a great opportunity to teach them about history and the truth that freedom is never free. Of course, the most memorable Veterans Cemetery is Arlington, but if you find yourself near DC, take time to go visit the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and witness the immense burial grounds yourself. It is worth the trip.

There are <u>so many great organizations</u> that seek to help those in the military as well as their families. Why not sit down as a family and budget some money this Memorial Day and choose an organization that you want to

invest in? Whether it's the spiritual or physical needs of active military or veterans that you decide to support, this is a great way to express your gratefulness to those who have served or are serving our country. We just sent a \$500 donation to Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing – an organization that helps wounded Veterans and many with PTSD to heal... what a worthwhile cause! And don't forget you can always donate to the Hershel Woody Williams Scholarship fund that is part of the Department of WV. I believe Chairman George Gill reported we've given out 155 scholarships totaling \$137,000 since 2000 and another worthwhile cause to also help keep Woody's dream alive! Speaking of Woody, you could donate to a Gold Star Family Memorial Monument currently under construction or help start one in your city/town. That was another of Woody's dreams...

Memorial Day is often viewed as the herald of summer. People use the extra day off to go on vacation or to plan get-togethers and cookouts. While none of these things are wrong, Memorial Day has a richer history. Its observance began after the Civil War, but it wasn't designated as a national holiday till 1971. To read more click here. Memorial Day is important to America's heritage and its legacy, but if we don't teach children about it, the freedoms we hold dear will be that much closer to slipping away. As Ronald Reagan once famously said, "Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We don't pass it to our children in the bloodstream. Take the opportunity this Memorial Day to teach your kids and grandkids (or great grandkids)--or someone else's--about this important holiday and its history.

Memorial Day services are held across the country and you can probably find one near you <u>here</u>. These services often include prayer, singing, and time to honor those who have served and given their lives. Even better, invite your whole family and friends to go with you to the service. Another very memorable event for your family or your Detachment is to attend the Memorial Day Program put on at a Military Installation or National Veterans Cemetery. The Cemetery in Dayton Ohio for instance has a military band, guest speakers, an Air Force Flyover and a 21-Gun Salute. It's an unforgettable display of patriotism for families and Veterans to see. If the Veterans Cemetery nearest to you doesn't conduct anything this spectacular, but it could still be just as meaningful.

We are fortunate to belong to this wonderful Marine Corps League organization. Members support each other in so many ways, not just within their own Detachment, but many Detachments assist other Detachments with funerals and events. The League can give Members a continued feeling of the comradery shared while on active duty and a sense of purpose and belonging. Memorial Day is as much for our Members as it is for Veterans we assist and don't even know.

And don't forget: prayer is one of the most important things you can do to remember Veterans and those who are currently serving our country on Memorial Day, especially Marines. And it's something anyone can do. Seek out a Veteran in your community or a military family and let them know you are praying for them. It might even help to write their prayer needs down as a reminder so that you won't forget to pray for them every day, and not only on Memorial Day. Continuing Detachment/Department Business

After June 30, all Detachments are required to file their IRS 990N reports with the Federal Government to maintain your Tax-Exempt Status

IRS 990N efile

All detachment must complete and file an IRS 990 N efile as your reporting period has been changed to the fiscal year ending June 30. Each Paymaster should be prepared to file after July 1 and submit a confirmed report to the Dept Paymaster. Do you need assistance with the filing? If so contact the Dept Paymaster Patti Leib (740)591-8611 or via email to pattileib024@gmail.com. She will assist and walk you through the process.

If your Detachment is not currently involved in with a local Veterans Administration Medical Center, find one and start volunteering! If one is not close enough, then look for a local VA Clinic... you can leave brochures, business cards, magazines like the Semper Fi or Leatherneck – or even take snacks, bottled water, or other small promotional items like ink pens with your Detachment's name and address on them to give out to Veterans and potential new members. Don't forget to carry applications wherever you go!

Boy Scout Chairman:

Is your Detachment involved in the MCL Eagle Scout Program?

Detachments should seek out Scout Troops and get involved with them. You can present Good Citizenship Awards to Eagle Scouts, join with them in a flag raising event, or invite them to a BBQ or picnic, maybe a hike or other outdoor event – or help them to volunteer their services to disabled or homebound Veterans. Paid Life Member Audit

The Paid Life Member Audits will be coming out in early to mid-July. You can tell the difference between the PLM Audit and your Detachment Roster as the Audit is printed in portrait orientation and the roster is printed in landscape. Last year they both listed the entire Detachment where the Audit should really only list the Paid Life Members. We'll see what they do this year...

Your Detachment should receive your annual ACH deposit by the end of this week, if all goes well. It's directly deposited into your Detachment's bank account, so if your Paymaster hasn't received it by next week, let the Department Paymaster know so she can follow on it for you.

The PLM Audit needs to be updated by lining through any Life Members who have passed away and including the date of their passing. Just draw a line through it and make sure it's still legible. Also check to make sure a Notice of Death (NOD) and a Transmittal have been submitted to the Department Adjutant-Paymaster so the records can be completed correctly. If your Detachment has new PLM's that don't show on this audit, you should add them at the bottom of the Audit. Include their names, Member ID, Profile ID, and if you have their Life Member number, include that, too.

Once the Audit is complete, then it needs to be signed and dated by the Detachment Commandant and Paymaster. Keep a copy for your records and send the original to the Department Paymaster. If you need assistance or have questions, please don't hesitate to call – it's easier to answer questions than it is to fix a problem, and there are No dumb questions!

Your Department Staff is here to help with anything that comes up. Get to know your new Department Officers and be sure to utilize their expertise. If they don't know the answer to your question, they will find out for you and we'll learn and grow and prosper together!
