Woof, Woof Devil Dogs! Midwinter is now past, and we are being hit by some large amounts of snow across our nation in the month of March. Thankfully, it is coming with warmer weather so that it is a lot easier to handle and does not last as long. We had another great Midwinter Conference last month, and all the Dogs attending had a great time. The Pups (black collar) and the Devil Dogs (red collar) that attended had a great experience to see how the Kennel works/operates. Hopefully, they will take those ideas back to their Pounds/Packs to continue to build on the fun and honor we maintain as the MODD.

The Chesty Puller Statue is having great success and representation at the Marine Corps Museum. I noticed some of the Dogs attending the Midwinter Conference making a special trip to see it. Your Kennel donated \$10,000 big bones to this cause last year and again at the Midwinter we voted to donate an additional \$10,000 big bones to the cause. That is a total of \$20,000 big bones from the Kennel in the past two years. I have been told the payoff of the statue is ahead of schedule; however, our fundraising must continue to grow. The brick buy program is a great way to donate and get some personal or organizational recognition for this. We here in Minnesota have grouped together and bought bricks for our detachments/department/pounds/packs/ and personal bricks to be able to have our bricks laid together at the statue. The brick is at a discounted rate, and this is a great way to go through this program to get one place for you or yours at the museum.

I made some strong decisions at Midwinter to take a long and hard look at our Pounds/Packs. There are some basic criteria that are required to maintain a Pound/Pack in good standing with the Kennel. I discussed these issues with each of the DVCCDs along with the Kennel Dog Robber, and we have sent out letters to get your dog house together or make a decision to turn in your Charter. There are things that can and need to be accomplished in any group or national accredited organization. We try to keep ours simple to accomplish. There is no excuse for any Pound/Pack not to be able to accomplish the following:

1. Pack Grand Growl (to be held in conjunction with the Department Convention)
2. Pack Election of officers (at the Grand Growl one time a year along with the installation)
3. Pack Installation Report submitted to Kennel immediately after Grand Growl (I would also send a copy to my CVCCD and make sure correct and complete information it in it. Missing or old phone numbers are of no help.)
4. Pack Initiation Team (Mad Dog) that does a fun/honorable/memorable initiation for Pups and Devil Dogs
5. Pack mail in their Passport Bones collected during their growls to the Kennel shortly after the growl
6. Pound hold four (4) growls a year

7. Pound Election of Officers to happen within ninety (90) days after the Supreme Growl
8. Pound Installation Report submitted to Kennel immediately after election/installation growl (I would also send a copy to my Pack Leader and DVCDD. Make sure correct and complete information is in it.)
9. Pound members working to bring in new members to the Order and a Mad Dog that will conduct a Pup Initiation that is welcoming/motivating/educational to all new Pups.
10. Pound mail in their Passport Bones collected in a timely manner, preferably after each growl.

The above list is a minimum requirement of all Packs/Pounds, and there is no reason that any of these cannot be accomplished. NO REASON! If they are not being accomplished, then the consideration of maintaining the Charter should be decided. I have sent letters via my Dog Robber, to each member of specific Pounds/Packs that are not at least meeting the above criteria or are not trying to maintain their existence giving them 90 days to get up to date or suspension of their Charter is in jeopardy. We are seeing some action to get up to date and are looking forward to more coming on line. You will notice I have not even mentioned the EINs, 990Ns, or state registration requirements. These all need to be worked and corrected; however, I understand that these issues will take more time working through the state/federal (IRS) governments. They are important and a little more difficult to bring back on line. If I elect to pull some Charters or Charters are turned in voluntarily, Dogs that are in those Pounds will be able to transfer to an active Pound or go At Large.

LEADERSHIP – I want to continue to talk to all Dogs about the leadership at all levels of the Kennel; from the Pound, to the Pack, to the Kennel. All the leaders, at all the levels, should be striving to make their own level better and stronger than it was before they took their position. Are you doing your part or just wearing the cover? You get a copy of the Kennel Dog Robber’s Installation Report (if not, ask your DVCDD for your information). You need to ensure the blanks are filled in.

You will see the main fundraiser for the Kennel within this WOG. It’s the Jr Vice CDD’s Sweepstakes program, and the tickets are located in this WOG. Please use them, get them mailed in as soon as possible, and get involved just a little bit. You could be the big winner! Mail in \$25 big bones for the opportunity to be what we talk about and give that extra effort.

Following the establishment of the MCL the leadership of the League decided the delegates needed some time during the serious deliberations to "blow off steam". As a result the Military Order of the Devil Dogs was organized and created in 1939, in Boston, MA. As an aside, when you get to a Supreme Growl look at the charter and fine the signature of Gen. Lejeune one of the Charter members of the MODD. PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

Proposed Bylaw amendment #1

Subject: Proposes Bylaws Change, Kennel Bylaws, MODD

In accordance with Article XIII, Section 1301, Kennel Bylaws, the following proposed change and rationale therefore is submitted for consideration at the 2013 Supreme Growl:

Article VII – Uniform – Section 703 – Identification Disc and Dog Collar

Add paragraph G:

Paragraph G to read:

- G. The seventy-fifth anniversary medallion issued to all present and registered at the Supreme Growl in Charleston, West Virginia, in 2014, may be worn with, or in lieu of, the official identification disc (Dog Tag) of the Order and/or the fiftieth anniversary medallion described in Article VII – Uniform – Section 703 – Identification Disc and Dog Collar, Paragraph F.

Rationale:

This is a milestone for the Military Order of Devil Dogs and the Kennel would like to mark this milestone with an anniversary medallion as they did for the fiftieth anniversary in Dallas, Texas in August 1989. If a dog was fortunate to register for both the fiftieth Supreme Growl and the seventy-fifth Supreme Growl they should be entitled to wear both anniversary medallions.

Proposed Bylaw amendment #2

Dennis currently the MODD bylaws state in Article V, Section 505, Paragraph C:

“All monies collected for Passport or Visa stamping shall be forwarded biannually, by 30 January and 30 June to the Honorable Kennel Dog Robber, who will hold these monies in a special Passport account.”

I would like to suggest that the wording be changed as follows:

“All monies collected for Passport or Visa stamping shall be forwarded after each growl to the Honorable Kennel Dog Robber, who will hold these monies in a special Passport account.”

The reason for the suggest change is to allow the Kennel to monitor how often growls are been conducted so assistance can be given to Pack/Pounds that are having difficulty in meeting the requirements of the Devil Dog bylaws by offering suggestions regarding the encouragement by the Pound Keeper in getting the dogs together.

Subj: PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGE, Kennel Bylaws, MODD

In accordance with Article XII, Section 1301, Kennel Bylaws, the following proposed chance and rationale therefore is submitted for consideration at the 2013 Supreme Growl:

Article V – Fiscal and Finance – Section 505 – Passport and Visa Stamps

Paragraph C currently reads: All monies collected for Passport, or Visa stamping shall be forwarded biannually, by 30 January and 30 June, to the Honorable Kennel Dog Robber, who will hold these monies in a special Passport account.

Amend Paragraph C to read: All monies collected for Passport, or Visa stamping are to be forwarded to the Kennel Dog Robber preferably when collected, but no less often than quarterly at the end of August, at the end of November, at the end of February and the end of May, in order that these monies be held in a Special Passport account.

Rationale: While it is a worthy goal that the monies be forwarded after each growl it is, at best, unrealistic, as it is difficult to get many pounds to forward the monies at all. By making it quarterly there is a greater likelihood that the monies will be forward than not. The reason for the months chosen to send the monies is so that the Kennel Dog Robber receives the last check in time to be deposited before the Kennel books are closed out for the fiscal year.

I thank you all again for your support with this donation.

It is that time of year again when anyone wishing to advance to PDD at the Supreme Growl in Grand Rapids needs to get their request to me. They must be in my hands prior to **July 1**. If the Advancement papers are not in on time you may be denied the opportunity to go through initiation and be obligated as a PDD. Please remember that the **Pack Dog Robber** must sign the request for advancement and that a copy should be kept by the Pack, Pound and by the individual Dog. Please bring your copy of the request with you as insurance against anything going wrong.

Please remember that the bylaws have changed. You must be in attendance by 5:00 PM on Monday.

Passport funds continue to arrive with many more Pounds contributing. However there are still way too many Pounds and Packs that have not sent in their bones. Pounds and Packs are required by the bylaws to hold at least 4 Growls per year. If you are holding the required Growls then the fee for stamping the passports should be sent in. The children's hospital in Michigan will be very grateful for your contribution.

I continue to receive Installation Reports with dates other than Sept through Nov. The bylaws state that Pound elections are to be held within that time period. We are not the same as the League.

All Packs and Pounds should be incorporated in order to protect themselves and to allow them to legally collect donations. Each should also have a EIN number from the IRS and be filing 990 forms annually. Send the information to the Kennel Dog Robber. If you do not file your taxes the IRS will revoke your tax exempt status. Trust me, you do not want to go through the hassle of all the paperwork and time to get re-established as a tax exempt organization. There is a new version of the Installation Report on the Kennel web site and new hard copy forms will be available shortly. Please use them.

Many members have still not renewed their membership for 2013. **Dog Robbers: Please follow up on this and get them paid!**

Three major awards are presented at the Supreme Growl, Kennel Dog of the Year, Kennel Pound Dog Robber of the year and Kennel Pack Dog Robber of the year. Nominations have been pitiful! If you have a Dog that you think is worthy of this honor please take the time to make the submission. Follow instructions in the bylaws and get them to me prior to July 20.

Up to date manuals are available on the internet web site. Please make sure you are using current versions of the Bylaws, Dog Robber manual and forms.

MID WINTER GROWL

Pound 210 donated a membership card and patch from 1941.

The dance contest was held and was won by PDD Gardner.

The raffle of the Box was won by PDD Joppa.

The 50/50 was won by PDD Luthardt.



All Applicants for Advancement and Membership must *first* register with the League for the Convention and then check in to the Dog House *prior to* 17:00 the Monday prior to the Supreme Growl.

Expenses

The Honorable Mad Dog will hold the Initial Costs to a total of 50 Big Bones. This will include the 25 Big Bones deposit for the collar (which is refundable with the return of the collar) and the Initiation Fee.

- All Application for Advancement forms must have the Pack Dog Robber Endorsement, where there is a Pack.

- Make sure the Applications are filled out completely. This includes the medical disclaimer.
- Incomplete forms will be returned

The following apply to Membership and Advancement to the degree of Devil Dog at the Supreme Growl only (See Article I, Section 101, paragraph F of the MODD Bylaws).

Candidates for membership in the Order at the Supreme Growl must have a minimum of three (3) years MCL membership.

Pups advancing to Devil Dog at the Supreme Growl must have two (2) years as a faithful PUP.



MEET PDD DONALD F. BROWNRIGG

~THE KENNEL'S OLDEST DOG~

Donald F. Brownrigg is one of the newest PDDs in the Military Order of the Devil Dogs, having advanced during the National Convention in Mobile, AL in August, 2012. At 97 years old, PDD Brownrigg is also the oldest Dog in the Kennel. He is a member of Keystone Capitol Pound #31 in the Pennsylvania Pack.

PDD Brownrigg enlisted in the United States Marine Corps on June 6, 1932 at the age of seventeen. He attended boot camp at MCRD San Diego and was assigned to a platoon of 23 or 24 recruits. During the seven weeks of basic training, instruction included close order drill, field exercises, riot control, and bayonet drill among other things. Brownrigg missed sharpshooter by one point with a score of 299. A score of 300 would have qualified him and given him a \$3.00 per month increase in pay. Subsequently, he qualified expert which paid \$5.00 per month extra. The basic pay for a private at that time was \$21 per month. At some point, Brownrigg became a distinguished marksman.

Following graduation, the entire platoon was sent to Sea School as they were scheduled to go aboard the USS Fulton, a survey ship converted to a gunboat with 3-inch guns. The Fulton had a crew of about 160 sailors and a detachment of thirty Marines to be used as a landing force to rescue US citizens or to protect US property. The Fulton sailed from San Diego in September, 1932. The first port of call was Pearl Harbor followed by a quick stop at Wake Island to check emergency supplies of food and water there which turned out to be uninhabited. The next port was Guam; however, Brownrigg didn't go ashore due to being on light duty after dropping a hatch cover on his foot. Eventually, the Fulton docked in the Cavite Naval Yard across the bay from Manila, Philippine Islands.

The Fulton became a part of the South China Patrol with a five city itinerary. On November 1, the Fulton sailed to Hong Kong where Brownrigg celebrated his eighteenth birthday on November 11, 1932. Then it was on to Canton for several days of liberty, Swatow, Foo Chow, and Amoy. The Marines rode in rickshaws in these towns and rented bicycles to ride around the countryside. Following the tour, the Fulton returned to Cavite Naval Yard for repairs and to Olongapo Naval Base for hull cleaning. In 1934 Brownrigg was promoted to PFC and made Corporal of the Guard.

In March of that year in mid-afternoon about sixty miles north of Hong Kong, the Fulton caught fire amidships when the engine, salvaged from a WWI German U-boat, backfired. General quarters were sounded, and Brownrigg went to his station on the forward deck. He and about sixty other Marines and Sailors were cut off from the fantail by the fire. A Chinese vessel stopped and removed the men from the fantail as Brownrigg watched. Eventually, an English destroyer, HMS Wishart, arrived and put her bow next to the Fulton's bow to allow Marines and sailors to jump. Big ocean swells caused the Wishart to tear a big hole in the Fulton's bow. Although Brownrigg slipped as he jumped, a big English sailor pulled him to safety. All hands made it safely to the Wishart. Eventually, the engine crew extinguished the fire with no explosions of fuel or ammunition.


After two weeks in Hong Kong, Brownrigg was assigned to the 4th Marines in Shanghai. On April 1, 1934, he reported to Company E, 2nd Battalion. He lost his rank because the PFC warrant was only for the ship; however, his net pay of \$17.65 per month was ample. The Marines had a houseboy who cleaned the barracks and made the racks. Vodka was five cents a pint, mixed drinks were twenty-five cents, and good scotch was only a dollar per liter. The Marines were billeted in the English section near Bubbling Well Road which was lined with nice shops and homes close to the Yangtze River. While there, the Marines manned gun emplacements occasionally and drilled often. They had Sunday parade at the race track. In greens and khakis, the Marines had to be sharp because they were in unofficial competition with the English, French, Germans, etc. The bayonets were nickel-plated, and the brass glistened.

In December, 1934, Brownrigg was ordered back to the States. He sailed aboard the USS Chaumont, stopping at Manila

for Christmas, Honolulu for four days, and passed under the Golden Gate Bridge arriving in San Francisco. He was ordered to Bremerton Naval Yard near Seattle, Washington where he was assigned to the Naval Receiving Station as a Brig guard which was considered good duty. He finished his enlistment there, being discharged on June 4, 1936.

Following his discharge, Brownrigg began his career in the lumber industry as a dishwasher in logging camp kitchens. He was fortunate to have work during the Great Depression until being laid off in early 1940. In September of that year, he got a job with a plywood plant in Aberdeen WA, which was later owned by Weyerhaeuser. He became a core layer, the second highest paying production worker. On February 22, 1941, he went to the wrong dance hall where he met Doris, a blue-eyed brunette. They married on December 29, 1941, a union that lasted sixty-nine years until her death on April 25, 2010.

When Pearl Harbor was bombed, Brownrigg was not subject to the draft because he was an ex-serviceman and was employed in an essential industry. However, in early 1943, he had his deferment cancelled and was called to active duty on April 15, 1943. After a second stint in boot camp, he was assigned to MCRD San Diego as a drill instructor. In December, 1944, he was sent to Camp Pendleton and left for Guam on January 5, 1945. He joined the 1st Battalion, 9th Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division after it came back from Iwo Jima. The Division began training for the invasion of Japan; however, before they could set sail, the atomic bombs were dropped, the Japanese surrendered, and. Subsequently, the 9th Marine Regiment was deactivated. At the time, a point system was in place for transferring Marines. Brownrigg was one point shy of being sent home and went to Guam until mid-December. His last trip to the United States was aboard the carrier, USS Bunker Hill. It arrived home on January 5, 1946, exactly one year from the date he left the United States. Brownrigg mustered out of the Marine Corps at San Diego on February 1, 1946.


